WESTERN CAPE NATURE CONSERVATION BOARD PERMIT APPLICATION TO IMPORT/EXPORT/ TRANSPORT/STOCK LIVE FISHES

(Nature Conservation Ordinance 19 of 1974)

PERMIT APPLICATION NOTES:

- 1. Permits are aligned to the above-mentioned Ordinance and all associated official policies and guidelines.
- 2. No permits will be issued for species on the PROHIBITED LIST.
- 3. Applications to stock invasive fish species may not be approved in CapeNature priority fish conservation areas.
- 4. Applications for stocking of indigenous fishes must align to CapeNature's Policy on the Conservation, Transport and Utilization of Indigenous Freshwater Fishes in the Western Cape Province.
- 5. Permitted zones exist for invasive alien species and these can be stocked within these zones with a valid permit. Applications for stocking outside permitted areas may require a risk assessment at the applicant's expense.
- 6. Fish may only be stocked in the water bodies indicated on this application form and the associated permit.
- 7. The co-ordinates of the water body to be stocked MUST be included in the application.
- 8. Kindly submit all applications to permits.fax@capenature.co.za along with proof of payment. Please do not send applications directly to CapeNature officials as *they will not receive attention*.
- 9. Applications not accompanied by a proof of payment of the R150.00 cannot be processed (see bank account details below). Please ensure that the **reference number** is indicated on the proof of payment.
- 10. No export permits will be issued without a copy of the relevant import permit.
- 11. Applications take a minimum of ten **working** days to be processed. Complex applications can take several weeks and may including site inspections. Please factor this processing period into your application.
- 12. For invasive fish species listed under the NEMBA AIS regulations, a permit from the Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries (DEFF) is required in addition to a CapeNature permit. It is the responsibility of the applicant to familiarise themselves with the DEFF application process and to ensure that such a permit is obtained, should one be required.
